

## WEB BASED LEARNING: - AN APPROACH IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEACHING

Higher education and advanced learning is not possible without English. These days the English language learnt by the learners in colleges is not adequate. It is deplorable to see that substandard language materials are provided to the learners which make them in turn to be not up to the standard of English language. The thirst for speaking and writing good English is not quenched. When they turn to websites one doesn't know how many of the sites are good and provide materials for real learning.

## METHODOLOGY

It involves two steps- sampling of materials and evaluating them. In order to select materials for evaluation we browsed through the internet and listed a number of sites and randomly chose a few websites.

## ANALYSIS

To evaluate the materials certain **criteria** was developed -

**Title:** should be attractive and the learner should comprehend the global idea of the activity.

**Objectives:** The intended outcome to be stated clearly

**Language:** should be simple, aimed at the level of the learners.

**Methodology:** Should always be providing an atmosphere where the learner can follow.

**Instructions:** Provide learner steps which the learner should and should not follow and should be clear and explicit

**Illustrations:** should be self explanatory and should be directly linked with the content of the unit.





**Structure of Units:** Proper divisions of units and sub- units should be lucid

**Contextualisation:** encourages learners to relate the text with practical experience drawn from real life situations.

**Assessment:** the learners get a chance to check how well they are meeting the objectives and provide feedback.

**Examples**

1. To help students prepare well for the exams around the clock online help was introduced by ‘egurucool.com’ that provides study materials or modules. These contain summaries of various topics meant for quick revision, practice tests and assignments, solved question papers in last five years and pre-board papers of leading institutions.
2. The website ‘allentrance.com’ has some lakhs of questions from various subjects taught in school, elementary, intermediate and advanced learners. The exercises offer a variety of theme and purpose.
3. The website ‘efl.esl.com’ was developed by Daisy A. Stocker in 1997 which consists of many categories. Learning English with laughter is one of them which contain “about the authors” “examples from our book”, “activity pages” and “children books”. Activity pages have 20 various activities about vocabulary, grammar, reading and writing. The author claims that this site is meant for teachers and students. The activities are meaningful and carried out in language skills and at all levels of language. The activities take in to account students age, interest and need for variety. This is one of the websites which aims to provide English Language materials for both learners and teachers. There are many activities for improving their language skills through practice and they also allow the learners to interact with tutors online. For example “English Channel: ESL” has units on Grammar, Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening. There are exercises to give practice in whatever is taught in the unit.

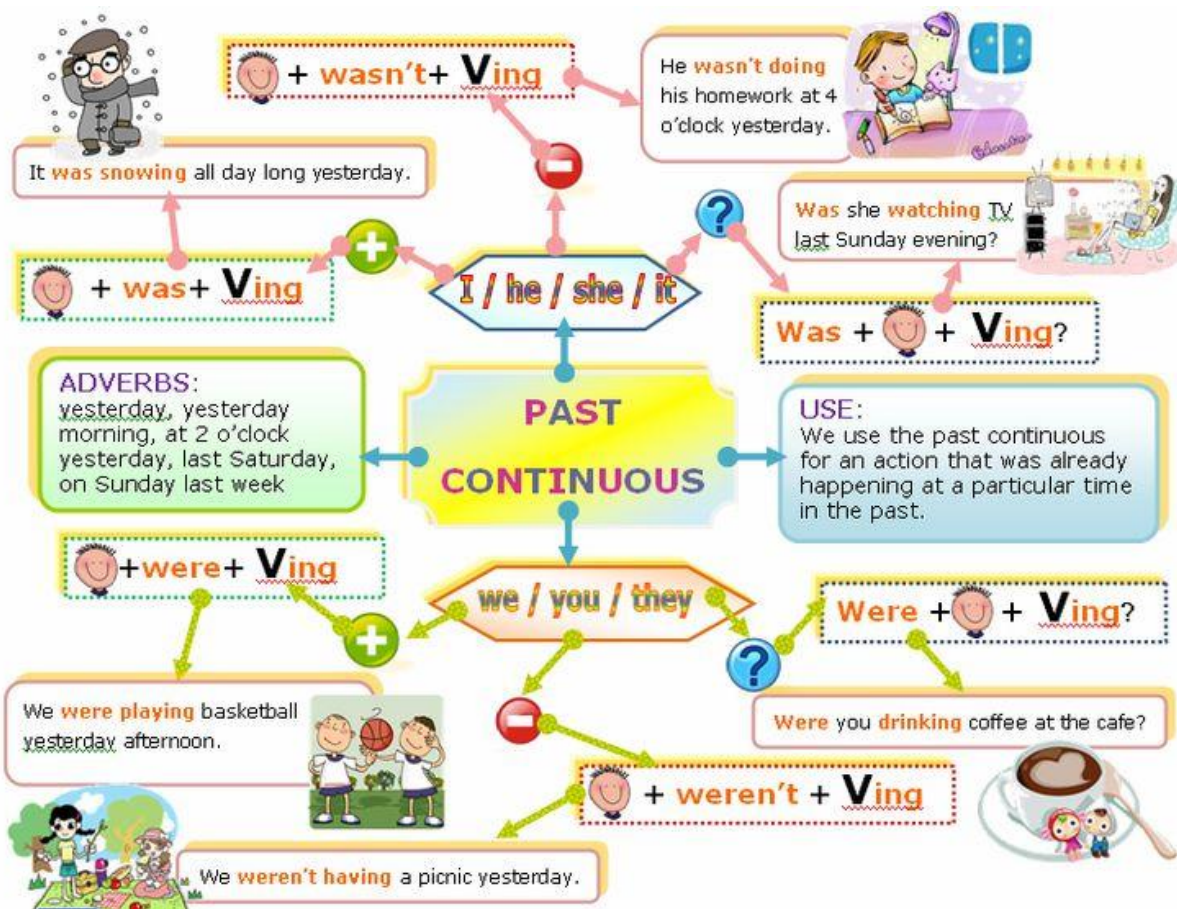
**Task 1** - We shall look at the unit on tenses.

In this unit tenses are dealt with. The tenses along with examples are given in a pictorial format and there are exercises following it. There is no explanation to understand how tenses are formed and where to use what tense. The students have to see the picture and understand what simple present, simple past etc is. Each tense is illustrated with only one example and the examples are isolated sentences. The presentation seems to focus on form but even that is not complete it is followed by practice task where students are supposed to practice tenses for some task there are no instructions given. Therefore users can do the task even without any instruction.

A variety of tasks are available on the web for various levels of learning, but had to select a few that aim at helping them develop their language skills.

### CONCLUSION

The websites browsed cater to language needs of students of all levels that is websites that provide materials for study for a particular level (efl.esl.com), websites which provide activities for preparing for examinations like GRE, TOEFL, IELTS etc., (free esl.com), some websites give only a summary of the usage of an item (English day.com) which is not



sufficient. Some activities are paid and some are free. Some websites offer online courses for which the user can only practice whatever he has learnt elsewhere. Some of the websites are traditional type like fill in the blank and match the following. Some include group work, pair work, writing and role play. Some are too simple. Some can be used in classroom but cannot be done by the user alone. They deal differently with different learners.

## SUGGESTIONS

1. Varying methods present a formidable challenge and many hurdles
2. No unity among them to follow one methodology
3. Before providing activities there should be presentation of each topic with good illustrations which encourages the user to visit the websites.
4. The instructions for each activity should be clear and elaborate
5. The materials should concentrate both on form and usage
6. The activities should not involve more than two persons
7. The tasks should be challenging and interactive
8. Some activities should not neglect the vital methodological considerations in which teacher plays a key role

Proper implementation of these suggestions will enable the learner benefited. It is also very helpful for the teacher because the suggestions involve pedagogical problems related to language learning.

All these together with actual classroom teaching can provide hours of interactive learning. The learning process is greatly accelerated in technology.

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
